Intraoperative Teaching Workshops

These interactive workshops will help to clarify a poorly discussed but important function of all clinical teachers – how we teach our learners in the Operating Room (OR). The *first workshop* will immerse the participant in the richness of clinical teaching in the OR and engender discussion of teaching principles. Participants will gain insight into their own teaching styles as well as the styles of others in their own and other disciplines. The *second workshop* will discuss teaching challenges that participants will bring to their groups. Real situations will be solicited and analyzed. The *third workshop* will discuss intraoperative teaching and relate it to teaching theory. The three workshops together will help clinical teachers to better teach in the complex situations of the OR.

HOW ARE YOU AND YOUR COLLEAGUES TEACHING YOUR RESIDENTS IN THE OR?

(Expose Yourself)

Wednesday, May 31, 2017
6:00—9:00 p.m.

Introduction: The Operating Room is a unique teaching environment, full of challenges. Clinical teachers must use varied teaching styles and avoid factors that detract from good teaching. Intra-operative teaching is indispensable in the training of surgeons, but literature on it is sparse. We have compiled an inventory of teaching techniques, styles and behaviours from many surgeons in Hamilton.



Becoming a good clinical teacher takes time, patience, dedication and attending Faculty Development activities!

Method: After a brief introduction to the literature, clinical teachers will facilitate small groups during three breakout sessions in this hands-on workshop. Participants will view several operative scenarios and discuss the beneficial and counterproductive teaching behaviours and styles they observe. Factors that affect the clinical teaching in each situation will be explored.

Participants will be challenged to make this workshop personally relevant by relating what they are learning from each other to their own teaching styles and principles and by committing themselves in concrete ways to be even better teachers.

**3 hrs.—BEST Pathway

OBJECTIVES:

- Participants will –
- describe the richness and complexity of teaching in the operating room;
 - learn from their fellow participants about operative teaching styles and behaviours and factors that affect teaching in the OR as they discuss the cases;
 - reflect and make explicit their own teaching styles and behaviours;
 - be able to critique teaching in the OR and;
 - take home their own recipe for improved teaching in the operating room.

REFLECTION & PRACTICE

(Immerse Yourself)

Wednesday, November 1, 2017
6:00—9:00 p.m.

After reflecting on your own teaching in the OR and returning to the OR to explore this topic in real-time, you will be asked to return with previous or new experiences or challenges that deserve discussion. The workshop will consist of small group discussion and analysis of the situations brought forward with an aim to providing the group with options for managing the situations. Small groups will present their scenarios to the larger group and justify the management option that they would choose. Large group discussions of the choice will be encouraged.

Theoretical Frameworks and Application in the OR *(Mastery)*

Wednesday, February 7, 2018
6:00—9:00 p.m.

With participants having discussed many teaching techniques, styles and behaviours in the OR environment, they will be ready to apply their knowledge to the scaffolding of teaching theory. Participants will be encouraged to take home their own theoretical frameworks, emphasizing the parts that work for them in the OR.
