Western University Pain Medicine Residency Lecture Series 2013-2015

Lectures will be allotted 2-3 hours of time starting at 13:00 on Wednesday afternoons. The exact dates of the presentations have yet to be determined.

The academic half-day for the Pain Medicine Residency will be unique in that a small number of residents will be enrolled in the program (no more than two per year). As such, academic half days will take on a tutorial format in which discussion between the teacher and students is encouraged.

Residents will also be granted protected time to attend academic half-days organized by other departments that also teach subjects related to pain medicine. The Department of Psychiatry has agreed to allow Pain Medicine residents to participate in selected teaching sessions, which overlap with their objectives of training. The Departments of Neurology and Physiatry have also agreed to participate in such an arrangement. There will be flexibility within the schedule to give residents the ability to attend these lectures if they are not scheduled on Wednesday afternoons.

There is flexibility within the schedule to add lectures that are not included in the current schedule but are identified by the residents to be in line with their personal educational objectives.
