<b>Kinark Child and Family Services</b>  <b>Rod Evans</b> <a href="mailto:rod.evans@kinark.on.ca">rod.evans@kinark.on.ca</a>	Full-time  3 or 6 mths	Kinark is the largest mental health organisation for kids in Ontario and provides a broad range of services across the GTA, from Peterborough in the east to Oakville in the West. There are 3 main clinical areas, community mental health, autism and youth forensic mental health services. For residents I would say that your standard placements would be available in community mental health and in forensics. It would be feasible to put something together focusing on administrative aspects of child and youth mental health including program evaluation, implementation of evidence based practices and quality management. Kinark has a dynamic research and evaluation department. It would be a good place to do a QA project.  Community mental health placements are possible in Peterborough, Simcoe County, Durham and York, so there is a mix of rural and urban possibilities. There is a strong multidisciplinary presence and a specific focus on delivery of evidence based practices. There is a mix of outpatient and residential programming. I understand that residents from U of T have given strong positive feedback about placements in the past. In fact a former resident from U of T is about to join us as staff.  Forensics are available at the Syl Apps Youth Centre in Oakville. This is a 50 bed facility for youth either in secure treatment (under the CFSA) or mentally ill youth in the Youth Justice System. There are a good number of adolescents with serious mental illnesses, schizophrenia etc., youth who have been ordered to be made fit to stand trial and youth who are not criminally responsible etc. The facility operates using DBT as its primary therapeutic framework. Also in the forensic area there is a community based residence for youth "stepping down" from Syl Apps in Peel Region, again using a DBT model. ( <i>Syl Apps could accommodate 2 residents at one time</i> ).

		<p>Again, the autism program is very strong, but I am not sure how a psychiatry resident would fit in that team at this time. I will make an effort to check into this.</p> <p>It occurs to me that with the extensive menu of evidence-based practices, a resident could gain intensive exposure to one or more of for example, DBT, CBT, Triple P, Solution Focused Brief Family Therapy etc., etc. with children, youth and families. As you can imagine with an operation of this size and scope, there are multiple sites across the province and all are linked with videoconferencing facilities.</p> <p>As you can see, there are a number of possibilities. Kinark is not an accredited training site at this point, but in the past has had links with U of T. With my connection with Mac and with the proximity of the Syl Apps facility to Hamilton, I am hoping that the connection with Mac will grow.</p>
